WINTER FLU JAB

It is more important than ever to ensure that you stay healthy over this winter so we strongly encourage you to book in for your free flu jab, available to anyone over 65 and those with specific medical conditions, such as:

- People with certain medical conditions (including children in at-risk groups from 6 months of age)
- Pregnant women
- People living with someone who's at high risk from coronavirus (on the NHS shielded patient list)
- Children aged 2 and 3 on 31 August 2020, those in primary school and children in year 7 (at secondary school)
- Frontline health or social care workers

All the local pharmacies and GPs offer this service and it's important to get the jab before winter takes hold.



AVOIDING SCAMS AND FRAUD
