# HELPING US TO MEET YOUR TRANSPORT NEEDS

It is getting busier and busier here at the Whitton Network and we sometimes struggle to find drivers. So whille we will continue to drive as many of you as possible, we may need to prioritise hospital and GP appointments over hairdresser and social trips. We will also try to make sure that we help those most in need with severe mobility difficulties. If we can't help you, remember that there are subsidised alternatives so it is worth registering for Dial a Ride. If you have certain conditions or are on some benefits you can automatically register, but call Transport for London on 0343 222 7777 to ask for an application form. Another option is to register for the London Councils' Taxi Card Scheme. This gives subsidised taxi trips. To find out more you can contact the London Borough of Richmond Supported Travel Scheme by telephone on 020 8831 6096 to ask for an application form.
